

# The International Soil Tillage Research Organisation Conference (ISTRO2024) is a wrap and it was a global success!



We had an excellent week in Virginia Beach, Virginia, USA, hosting the International Soil Tillage Research Organisation (ISTRO) conference! Scientists from around the world gathered to showcase their innovative research aimed at sustaining global food production systems.

Theme: "Living Roots, Living Soil" focusing on regenerative agriculture, soil health, cover crops, residue systems, and sustainable crop production.

#### Key Highlights:

- Networking: ISTRO2024 emphasized the importance of collaboration to enhance research and establish fruitful partnerships.
- Participation: 198 scientific abstracts presented by 512 authors and co-authors from 35 registered countries. Including attendees living and working outside their homeland, we had representation from over 42 countries.
- Sessions: The general session included presentations on Virginia agriculture and the Global Agricultural Productivity Report (GAP), followed by 3 days of oral and poster presentations in breakout sessions.
- Farm Visits: Attendees visited farms growing soybean, potato, snap beans, corn, and other crops. Discussions included Coastal Plain soil, manganese deposits, and summer cover crop roots nearly 6-feet deep.
- Working Groups: ISTRO2024 concluded with sessions focused on future collaboration and targeted research ideas.

Overall, ISTRO2024 was a resounding success, fostering global collaboration and advancing sustainable agricultural practices.

### International Soil Tillage Research Organisation Conference




We had an excellent week in Virginia Beach, Virginia, USA as we hosted the International Soil Tillage Research Organisation (ISTRO) conference! Scientists from around the world made their way to Virginia to highlight their innovative research to sustain our global food production systems. ISTRO2024's theme was "Living Roots, Living Soil" to focus on regenerative agriculture, soil health, cover crops, residue systems and sustainable crop production as a whole.

We aimed to focus on how sustainable practices impact the soil. Networking is a key role of this conference as we must work collectively to improve each other's research to establish fruitful collaborations to utilize within our research networks. Overall, we had 198 scientific abstracts presented representing 512 authors and co-authors from 35 registered

countries. We had 42+ countries present if you count people now living and working somewhere other than their homeland.

ISTRO2024 kicked off with a general session that included presentations about Virginia agriculture, the Global Agricultural Productivity Report (GAP, <a href="https://globalagriculturalproductivity.org/2024-gap-report/">https://globalagriculturalproductivity.org/2024-gap-report/</a>). Conference attendees then presented their work via oral and poster presentations in breakout sessions throughout the week. The most exciting day of the conference allowed attendees to visit farms that grow soybean, potato, snap beans, corn, among other grains and vegetables. We ventured below the soil to discuss our Coastal Plain soil, saw a nice manganese deposit, and measured summer cover crop roots nearly 6-feet below the soil surface. The last day of the meeting ended with working groups designed to ensure collaboration in the future that focused on targeted research ideas.






